Doreen Moses, 2737 Devonshire Pl., viewed the city's present study of Klingle Road as already being representative of a broader scope of issues rather than limited interests.

Unidentified Woman expressed concern about safety around Klingle road.

Ruth Hunsberger, 3606 35th St., made a motion for the Commission to sense the sentiment of the present group.

Robert Solomon summarized the key statements of Mr. Burch and urged the Commission to support Mr. Burch's view of keeping Klingle Road closed.

Following comments from the assembly, whose overwhelming opinion was to keep Klingle Road closed, **Commissioner Blum presented a resolution supporting the closure of Klingle Road** and its conversion to a hiking/biking area. Commissioner Mendelson stated his reasons against the Commission's taking a position at that time: the need for them to see a traffic study; and the possibility for a required rulemaking. He also stated his feelings about the Commission's opposition to the reopening of Klingle Road and urged that a position about this issue not be taken. Commissioner Blum took issue with Commissioner Mendelson on his position and reminded him of her request to have his constituents present who opposed the reopening of Klingle Road to be present at the ANC meeting as well as the Commission's earlier decision to delay taking a position until hearing a report from D.P.W. Several comments were offered by other Commissioners.

A roll call vote was taken: Commissioners Blum and Opacinch voted in favor of the resolution. Commissioners Ingram, Mendelson, Wamsley, Gordon, and Bates opposed the resolution. Commissioner Doggett abstained. **The resolution was defeated: 2 ayes, 5 nays, and 1 abstention.**
